



RECENT SUCCESS STORY

Newborn Overcomes Critical Condition at KIOCH - Damak Children's Hospital

In a remarkable story of resilience and expert medical care, a newborn baby, B/O Kumari Acharya, was successfully treated at KIOCH Damak Children's Hospital after facing severe complications at birth.

Admitted to the hospital's Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) on 2081-8-7, the one-day-old baby was brought in with critical symptoms, including delayed crying after birth and abnormal jerky movements. Diagnosed with Birth Asphyxia HIE-2, Early-Onset Neonatal Sepsis (EONNS), and Congenital Pneumonia, the infant faced additional challenges as the child of a diabetic mother.

The medical team immediately placed the baby on a non-invasive ventilator for three days, followed by oxygen support for another three days. Thanks to the diligent efforts of the healthcare staff and the hospital's advanced facilities, the baby showed significant improvement. After 11 days of intensive care and gradual recovery, the baby was discharged on 2081-8-18 in stable condition.

DONATION RECIEVED FROM DR. BISHNU DEV PANT & MRS. BEENA PATHAK PANT






