KIOCH-DAMAK CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL

Sapana Kumari Majhi, 9-year-old female diagnosed with Nephrotic syndrome, steroid-sensitive, at KIOCH-Damak Children's Hospital 9 months ago. She is from an economically poor background with no family support. The previous two admissions were free of cost. This marks the third admission diagnosed as Frequently relapsing Nephrotic syndrome.presented at the OPD with anasarca and pleural effusion/ascites in distress, they initially refused admission due to a lack of money for food. We managed to arrange food supply and admitted the child. She was discharged on 4th Feb after 9 days of admission; she went into remission, and her smile returned.






CLINICAL COUNCIL PRERANA WEBINAR

K-PALS UPDATE

PRERANA hosted a vital webinar titled "Bridging the Gaps in CHD Awareness and Care" during CHD Awareness Month, drawing pediatricians from the USA and Nepal. Speakers included Dr. Dilli Bhurtel from Children's Hospital of Richmond, Dr. Christopher Snyder from AAP, Dr. Urmila Shakya and Dr. Rabindra Bhakta Timala from SGNHC, and Dr. Bhagwan Koirala from KIOCH, with Rajesh Pandey moderating. Discussions focused on early CHD detection, timely management, the need for comprehensive children's heart centers, and policy changes to attract talent into congenital surgery and pediatric cardiology. This collaborative effort highlighted Nepal's readiness for early CHD intervention, emphasizing phased approaches and increased advocacy for CHD screening.





CONTINUING MEDICAL EDUCATION OPPORTUNITY: WEBINAR FOR AMA PRA CATEGORY 1 & ABP MOC PART 2 CME CREDIT K-PALS UPDATE

Our webinar "Pediatricians and Residents Education and Research Advancement in Nepal and America" has been approved for up to 1 AMA PRA Category 1 credit to be awarded to practicing physicians only. This activity has been authorized under our joint accreditation providers and does not indicate a partnership with Children's Health. As a member of the Children's Health Medical Staff, we will waive the Joint Providership fee.

ABP MOC Part 2 CME credit refers to Continuing Medical Education credits that are part of the Maintenance of Certification (MOC) process for physicians certified by the American Board of Pediatrics (ABP). This type of credit is earned through activities that contribute to ongoing professional development and is a requirement for maintaining board certification. This activity has been planned and implemented by the accreditation requirements and policies of the Texas Medical Association (TMA) through the joint providership of Children's Health and KIOCH Partners of America (KPALs). TMA accredits Children's Health to provide continuing medical education for physicians.

The Children's Health designates this Live activity for a maximum of 1 AMA PRA Category 1 Credit™. Physicians should claim only the credit commensurate with the extent of their participation in the activity.

For ABP MOC II, the learners must complete an assessment following the CME activity. The assessment is generated from the speakers in relevance to the specific lecture. It will need to be five questions in any format. (T/F, multiple choice, etc.) Once the test is answered correctly, The certificate will populate, reflecting the MOC part 2 credit.
