2. Purpose of Document

The purpose of this Terms of Reference (ToR) is to recruit (Fixed Term Contract) Program Officer who will support in "The PEN-Plus Partnership: Country-level PEN-Plus Project Initiation & Implementation in Nepal" and other works of Nepal NCDI Poverty Commission and KIOCH. This document will provide the position's background, conditions, and responsibilities.

3. Background

The Nepal NCDI Poverty Commission (Nepal NCDI PC) is a pioneering group of disease specialists, economists, and epidemiologists from government and non-government organizations (NGOs) working to address NCDs and

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equity in Nepal. The Commission was established in response to an initiative of the global Lancet Commission on Reframing Non-Communicable Diseases and Injuries for the Poorest Billion (The Lancet NCDI Poverty Commission). The commission is created by an alliance of multidisciplinary and multi-sectoral teams working at the national level for non-communicable diseases in Nepal. The commission is housed in the Kathmandu Institute of Child Health (KIOCH).

KIOCH is a not-for-profit organization registered with the Government of Nepal (GoN), to deliver high-quality and affordable multispecialty care to children across Nepal by building a comprehensive pediatric care facility within the nation and conducting research activities to act upon preventable deaths due to NCDs.

KIOCH received grant support from the NCDI Poverty Network to implement PEN-Plus in Nepal in 2021. This is an initiative of the Nepal NCDI-Poverty Commission, housed in KIOCH, to reach the poorest population in Nepal and address severe chronic NCDs. This approach aims at decentralizing NCD service delivery at lower levels of the health system to maintain the continuum of care, systematize a hierarchy of referral chains from the primary health care center (PHCC) to the first-level referral center (usually a district hospital) and then to the higher center, and ultimately protect the vulnerable population from financial hardship.

Now, in partnership with the Ministry of Health and Population (MoHP) with the involvement of various departments of health services, KIOCH is implementing the PEN-Plus project in Nepal. Likewise, in 2022, KIOCH received funding support from UNICEF Nepal to expand the very project in four more districts with a precise focus on severe and chronic NCDs among children and adolescents, including neurodevelopmental disorders.

4. Purpose:

The Program officer with public health background will be responsible for overseeing Training activities, project work plans, participating in project planning, budgeting, implementation, monitoring& evaluation, and reporting of the project progress and issues, and for providing creative solutions to them. S/he will directly report to the NCD Specialist.

5. Tasks and responsibilities

The main tasks & responsibilities of the Program Officer will include the following:

5.1 Project planning, implementation, reporting:

- Responsible for coordinating with EDCD, NHTC and other Governmental stakeholders to conduct PEN-Plus training at Center and Sites.
- Responsible for arranging the logistics and other necessary arrangement to conduct PEN Plus training at Center and Sites.
- Coordinate with field officer of different sites to cater the referred cases which need most specialized care
 in the Center.
- Undertake other program administration tasks.
- Report to NCD Specialist for any changes which impact the project implementation

5.2 Monitoring and Evaluation

- Develop monitoring and evaluation frameworks for projects.
- Monitor project activities, expenditures, and progress towards outcomes.
- Communicate project expectations clearly to team members and partners.
- Collect, compile, and analyze data for monitoring purposes.
- Review quarterly, half-yearly, and annual performance reviews.

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- Supervise program activities to ensure high standards and adherence to plans.
- Analyze program data and provide feedback to the program team and partners.
- Prepare presentations on program progress for various meetings and forums.
- Conduct monitoring visits to program districts and document progress.
